Essentialism within the biological framework

**Summary of the Doctoral Thesis (maximum 300 words)**

Generally, the notion of ‘essence’ has been characterized as referring to necessary and sufficient properties that characterize an entity. This essentialist thinking, although also prevalent within the biological framework during some decades of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, has currently been put into question due to the acknowledgement of the changeable nature of organisms (e.g., evolving, developing...), that can manifest completely different properties at different stages of their development. The goal of this thesis consists of exploring the way in which essentialism can play a role within the biological framework, maybe reconsidering the notion of the essence, or accepting that, in fact, the biological world is full of processes, and the notion of essence is not able to play a role in it.
