The role that metaphysics is beginning to play within various scientific disciplines—such as physics, chemistry, and biology—is becoming increasingly prominent. Despite having been dismissed and stigmatized for years due to the influence of logical positivism, it is now evident that considering the role of metaphysics in these disciplines contributes to a better understanding of the world around us. One of the disciplines where this work remains to be done, however, is medicine. This thesis aims to explore the bridges and connections that can be established between metaphysics and medicine, focusing in particular on addressing concepts such as 'health,' 'disease,' and 'the body.' Specifically, it seeks to ensure that the study of these interactions also sheds light on how medicine has conceptualized and characterized the female body.
